### **Application Guidelines for the Admission**

### to the Higher Agricultural Specialist Program for the Republic of Kazakhstan for the Master's Degree at the Graduate School of Integrated Arts and Sciences, Niigata University

The Graduate School of Integrated Arts and Sciences, Niigata University, offers a program, the Higher Agricultural Specialist Program for the Republic of Kazakhstan, which was selected as one of the International Priority Graduate Programs (PGP), Advanced Graduate Courses for International Students, by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT). Therefore, the Graduate School of Integrated Arts and Sciences, Niigata University, accepts applications for October 2026 admission from those interested in pursuing a master's degree in this program as follows.

### 1. Outline of the Program

As the gateway to the Sea of Japan, Niigata University makes great efforts in promoting education and research opportunities with Central Asia which is located at a strategic point in the Central Corridor linking Asia and Europe. This program, based on a request from the Kazakhstan's scientific institutions, the Ministry of Science and Higher Education and others, aims to foster advanced agricultural specialists urgently needed by the Government of Kazakhstan and to nurture researchers who possess international as well as local perspectives. Student participants in this program will be matriculated at the Graduate School of Integrated Arts and Sciences, Niigata University, as full-time regular students and pursue a master's degree by taking required courses and conducting research within two years, the standard number of years required to complete the program.

### 3. Eligibility for Application

An eligible applicant is considered to be someone applying as an international student, conforming to any of the conditions listed below.

- (1) Those who have graduated from a university stipulated in Article 83 of the School Education Law (Law 26 of 1947) or who expect to graduate by September 2026.
- (2) Those who have obtained a bachelor's degree according to the provisions of Article 104 Section 7 of the School Education Law or who expect to obtain such a degree by September 2026.
- (3) International applicants from countries which do not require sixteen years of school education before university graduation who fulfil the following two conditions, and who are deemed by the Graduate School to have academic ability equivalent to or greater than graduates of a Japanese university. (Refer to Note)
  - a. Those who after finishing university have engaged in research for a minimum of one year as research students or researchers at a university, research institute or equivalent institution either in Japan or another country or who expect to have pursued such research for a minimum of one year by September 2026.
  - b. Those who are 22 years old by September 30, 2026.
- (4) Those who have completed sixteen years of education in a country other than Japan or who expect to have completed such education by September 2026.
- (5) Those who have completed sixteen years of school education in a country other than Japan by taking lessons in Japan through a distance learning program provided by that other country or

who expect to complete such education by September 2026.

- (6) Those who have completed or expect to complete by September 2026, in Japan, the curriculum of a university of a country other than Japan (limited to those who have completed a sixteen-year curriculum in the school education of that country) where this educational facility is recognized by the school educational system of that country and has been specifically designated by the Minister of Education, Sports, Culture, Science and Technology.
- (7) Those who have obtained a qualification equivalent to a bachelor's degree or who expect to obtain such a qualification by September 2026 in a university or other school in a country other than Japan (limited to those universities or schools whose general educational research activities have been recognized by a person certified by the government or relevant organ of that country or specifically designated as equivalent by the Minister of Education, Sports, culture, Science and Technology) and who have completed a course of study with a program of at least three years (including completion of that program by taking classes in Japan through distance learning provided by the school in the country concerned where the school is an educational institution recognized by the school educational system in that country and has been specifically designated by the Minister of Education, Sports, culture, Science and Technology). (Refer to Note)
- (8) Those who have completed after the date specified by the Minister of Education, Sports, Culture, Science and Technology or expect to complete by September 2026 a specialized course at a professional school specifically designated by said Minister (limited to courses of study of a minimum of four years and which reach the standards set by said Minister).
- (9) Those designated by the Minister of Education, Sports, Culture, Science and Technology
- (10) Those matriculated at a graduate school as specified in the provisions of Article 102 Section 2 of the School Education Law and who are deemed thereafter to have adequate academic ability to pursue education in the graduate school of this research department. (**Refer to Note**)
- (11) Those who by September 30, 2026 will have attended university for a minimum of three years as set out in Article 83 of the School Education Law, who are considered likely to obtain excellent results in the credits prescribed by this research department and who have completed fifteen years of school education in a country other than Japan. (Refer to Note)
- (12) Those who following individual screening of eligibility for application to this research department are approved as having academic ability equivalent to or greater than a university graduate and who will be 22 years old by September 30, 2026. (Refer to Note)

Those eligible to apply on the basis of (3), (7), (10), (11) and (12) above should submit the "Application Documents" to the program director by Monday, December 22, 2025.

Eligibility screening results will be announced individually by the program director on or after Friday, January 9, 2026.

### 7. Method of Admission Selection

Admission Selection shall be made upon the evaluation of application documents and interview. (Note) Interviews will be conducted either face to face or by interactive vocal or visual communication via Internet.

## 9. Announcement of Admission Decision Friday, March 6, 2026

No telephone inquiries regarding the admission decision will be answered.

### 10. Scholarship for Accepted Students

Students who are accepted to the program and meet the eligibility requirements to apply for the Japanese Government Scholarship Program may be recommended as MEXT student nominees. When they are granted the scholarship, they will receive the following support;

- (1) Monthly stipend: JPY 144,000
- (2) Period of Scholarship: For the standard period of years required to complete the master's program (from October 1, 2026, to September 30, 2027)
- (3) Transportation:
  - Students will be provided an airline ticket when entering Japan, and when completing the degree program and returning to their home country by the final month of the scholarship period. The Provided airline ticket will be an economy-class ticket for the flight between the international airport closest to the student's residence (in principle, the country of nationality) and the international airport used for the normal route to/from Niigata University.
- (4) Fees Required for Entering Niigata University:
  Student participants are exempted from the entrance fee and tuition for the standard period of years required for completion.
- (5) Other: If for any reason the student participants' stay at Niigata University exceeds the standard number of years required for completion, if they are expelled or transferred, or in any way violate the oath made to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, even after matriculation, the scholarship stipends will not be provided.

## 11. Eligibility Requirements to Apply for the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Program

- (1) Nationality: Applicants having a nationality from the CIS countries at the time of application will have preference.
- (2) Age: Applicants must have been born on or after April 2, 1991.
- (3) Academic Background: Those who have obtained a bachelor's degree or are expected to obtain such a degree by September, 2026; or those who, following the individual screening of their eligibility for application, are approved by the Graduate School of Science and Technology, Niigata University as having academic ability equivalent to or greater than those who have graduated from university and who will be 22 years old by September 30, 2026.
- (4) Major Field of Study: Those who studied one of the following fields at a university are eligible to apply: Management of Food and Resources; Plant Resource Production; Animal Resource Production; High Level Use of Plant Functions; Enhancement of Microorganism Functions; Elucidation of Food Functions; Sustainable Agricultural Produce; Conservation and Use of Forest Resources; Local Management Engineering; Agricultural Engineering; Fluctuation of Water Circulation; Atmospheric Environment.
- (5) Academic Grades: Those who have had a GPA of 2.30 or higher, based on the calculation formula specified by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), in the past years and who are expected to maintain a GPA of 2.30 or higher during the period in which they receive their scholarship stipend.
  - \*Niigata University will calculate the students' GPA upon receipt of the application documents.
- (6) Recommendation: Those who are recommended officially by the president or dean of the graduate school of a university in the CIS countries with which Niigata University has concluded a cooperation agreement or where there are other close collaborations with Niigata University
- (7) Other: Any applicant who meets any of the following conditions is NOT eligible to apply for the scholarship.

- a. Those currently in the military service.
- b. Those who are unable to arrive in Japan by the date specified by Niigata University.
- c. Those who apply for this scholarship from another university and who are granted any other scholarships for international students from the Japanese government (MEXT) or the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO).
- d. Those who expect to obtain a scholarship or fellowships from Japanese government, a Japanese government-related and others.
- e. Those who do not meet the expected eligibility requirements or conditions by the specified date.
- f. Those who have dual nationality at the time of application and cannot prove that they have renounced their Japanese nationality by the time they arrive in Japan.
- g. Those who in the past were international Japanese government (MEXT) scholarship students and who would not have at least three years of educational or work experience from the month after the final payment of the previous scholarship to the starting month of the new scholarship.
- h. Those who after applying hope to undertake fieldwork or an internship in a country other than Japan.
- i. Those who failed the entrance examination for the master's degree program at the Graduate School.
